“ Bishop Jones was a gift of compassion for the homeless, for those who had little and for those looking to make a difference in the community. It was exciting during the late 90's and the start of the next century to feed the homeless on Lower Wacker Drive, Under bridges and in the immediate neighborhoods every Monday night. I can still remember us taking sleeping bags, socks, coats and food to those who lived on Lower Wacker Drive one December before the cold weather set in. Bishop Jones was instrumental in introducing me to Store Front Pastors, Small Church Pastors and Mega Pastors as I worked with Chicago Metro Baptist Association to expand compassion and love to all the communities in our city. I have fond memories of enlisting my dad to come down and help me along with some church members at Rose of Light to finish running the electrical on the second floor so we could begin using the entire facility. I remember Pastor Jones instructions when going home late at night to go directly to the interstate and home and if things don't seem right just run all the red lights and get to the interstate. Despite all the bad press for the Englewood Neighborhood, I walked the streets and never felt fearful and never encountered any problems. I found thousands of Christians looking for away to change the neighborhood and keep their kids safe. It was a joy to be a part of that effort for 7 years. I will forever be grateful to Pastor Jones for being my mentor and my teacher. I look forward to seeing you again when God calls me home.
