“ I met Mrs Henry in 1977 as a new Children's Librarian at Sherman Park Library. She was the Principal Clerk and it didn't take long for me to see she was at the top of her game. She took her job seriously, she was kind and patient with the clerks under her supervision and with her co-workers. She was excellent in training others. Her reports were on time and accurate. After about 6 years at Sherman Park I became head of the library, and as a result her supervisor. She always respected my position but also nurtured me in her own special way. When she learned my birthday was June 22 and the year I was born she told me it had been her first day on the job that date and year. I told her I was born around 6pm and she said she had been on the job a couple hours by that time. Mrs. Henry loved her children. She often talked about Debra and Howard Michael and your achievements. I know you brought her so much pride and joy and you took good care of her. I learned about savings bonds from her and was in awe on how well they served her when it was time for Debra and Howard Michael to go to college. She loved Third Baptist church and the pastors who served. She told me she lived on the west side when she first came to Chicago and had sung with the Thompson Community Singers. Mrs. Henry never forgot my birthday. I always received a card (sometime with a picture of herself) and a phone call. It was fairly easy to remember hers as well (March 22). I left Chicago Public in 2004 and she kept in touch up until this year when her health prevented her from doing so. I'll miss that card and phone call this year but I'll rejoice knowing Mrs. Henry is in flight to meet the God she served who promised all of us we would see him if we stayed faithful over a few things. I will continue to keep you Debra and Howard Michael and your family in my prayers.
